


INDIGENOUS FUTURES SURVEY

The Indigenous Futures Survey (IFS) is the largest Native-led nationally representative survey designed to capture the voices, perspectives, and concerns of Native peoples living in the US. In 2023, we launched the third iteration of IFS and gathered responses from 5,240 Native peoples, with representation from all 50 states. Learn more about IFS at IllumiNative.org/iFS

Native people are overwhelmingly civically engaged.




Native people are represented across the political spectrum.

Informing State-Specific Strategies


IFS 3.0 identified the top priority issues that will influence how people vote in the 2024 election and the top barriers to voting in key states. 11 states were identified as key priority states based on Native population and organizing potential. With this information in hand, organizers, Tribal leaders, and allies can develop strategies specific to their communities.

Tribal Sovereignty:

The ability for Tribal Nations to govern, protect, and enhance the health, safety and well-being of their Tribal Citizens.

Priority Issues in Key States

A candidate's stance means more than political affiliation for voters in Indian Country. Almost 60% of those surveyed in key states indicated that a candidate's position on priority issues influences how they vote.

Top Barriers to Voting in Key States

On average, more than half of those surveyed in key states have experienced barriers to exercising their right to vote.
